The Stephen Series system trains and organizes lay people to do caring ministry under the direction of Beth Hart, Director of Stephen Ministry, and Nancy Drake, Stephen Leader, along with the support of Pastor Don Tabler. Those who have received or are receiving care understand that their identity and what goes on in the one-to-one caring relationship will remain strictly confidential. It is a fundamental component of Stephen Ministry. We think of ourselves as the one important ministry we can't really discuss! But the appeal of this Christ-centered care is growing, and the worth of this ministry is being felt more and more.

Our Stephen Ministers – Evelyn Arroyo, Dan Conklin, Suzanne Conklin, Lu Ebrado, Millie Grey, Marge Hendrickson, Brian Mortensen, Elsa Mortensen, Elaine Nurse, Sherry Peterson, and Sallie Trainor – have received 50 hours of intensive training.
